WHO: Washington, DC/ March 6, 2022: The National Federation of Democratic Women (NFDW) will hold its virtual Democratic Women in Blue (WIB) Advocacy Day on the Hill via Zoom.

WHAT: This year's Women in Blue theme: "When Women Vote - Democrats Win: From the Courthouse to the Whitehouse," embraces the DNC's 57-State Partnership of leaving no voter behind. In rural, urban, or suburban communities - red, purple, or blue areas, all voters matter.

WHEN: The virtual NFDW/ Women in Blue Advocacy Day will occur from 11:00 am to 3:00 pm ET on Wednesday, March 9, 2022.

HOW: The Women in Blue Advocacy Day will feature Democratic leaders from Congress and other notable guests whose focus will center on strategies to protect voting rights, the basic tenets of democracy, and to combat voter suppression and subversion across the country.

WHY: Our goal is to pursue action strategies to empower Democrats to counter the tactics of voter suppression, threats to foundational democratic principles, and culture war misinformation campaigns from the grassroots to the Capitol. The Women in Blue Advocacy Day will bring together over 200 NFDW members from our thirty (33) state federations who will meet virtually with their legislators on their 15 position papers and advocate for issues important to women, families, and children. NFDW members will wear blue as a symbol of their solidarity with each other and the Democratic Party.


