WHEREAS, members recognize Joanne Sullivan for her service as the 21st President of the National Federation of Democratic Women for the term of office from June 2015 to June of 2017; and

WHEREAS, Joanne has dedicated her life to public service working to elect Democrats at the local, state and the federal level and has been involved in the political process for over twenty-seven years; and

Named the "Outstanding Member of the NFDW" in 2009, she served on the Nominating Committee in 2003 and 2011, was elected the 4th Vice-President in 2013 and served as Chair of the Resolutions Committee for four years; and

WHEREAS, she was appointed to act as the liaison to the 2015 NFDW Convention in Atlantic City by the NFDW Executive Board, she worked very closely with the members of the New Jersey Federation to ensure the event's success; and

WHEREAS, a the beginning of her term as NFDW President she rewrote the NFDW Handbook and represented the NFDW in Miami to submit a resolution honoring President Tsai Ing-wen, the first female head of state of Taiwan; and

WHEREAS, Joanne attended the 2016 Democratic National Committee Convention in Philadelphia and represented the NFDW at the DNC Executive Committee meetings; and

WHEREAS she has fulfilled all the functions of serving as NFDW President in an exemplary fashion, always in a professional, gracious and friendly manner.
