National Federation of Democratic Women Resolution Supporting Former President Barack Obama's Campaign to End the Spread of Disinformation



WHEREAS, in today's world, disinformation refers to a coordinated campaign by political leaders, corporations, or other figures to spread harmful falsehoods and misleading narratives; and

WHEREAS, according to *Psychology Today*, disinformation creates serious problems for citizens as they navigate the media, science, politics, economics, education, and social inequality. "Disinformation campaigns spread like wildfire in our social media bubbles and echo chambers through likes, shares, and reposts. They take on a life of their own as myths are taken as unexamined facts. Disinformation campaigns take advantage of people's most basic behavioral influences, that is emotions. Evoking emotions increases the likelihood of believing fake information," said Julia R. Ancis (Ancis, 2021); and

WHEREAS, former President Barack Obama has launched a campaign to end the rampant spread of disinformation and to warn that the scourge of online falsehoods has eroded the foundation of democracy. He stated, "I didn't realize how susceptible we had become to lies and conspiracy theories. People are dying because of disinformation."
